Happy February Everyone,

As I write this, we have just celebrated Martin Luther King Jr. Day. I watched the commemorative service on the holiday, and it made me think about a number of things that I have thought about before, but it was beneficial to reflect on anew. How far have we come after all these years since the "I Have a Dream" speech of August 28, 1963? How united are we with our fellow man? Politically we seem more divided than ever before. Religiously too. How many of us treat one another equally regardless of race, economic status, gender or various other factors? If you ask one person, they will say we have come along way, and another will say hardly progress at all has been achieved. One more topic for us to be divided over.

One of the speakers said we should live together as brothers and sisters instead of die together as fools. How true but how difficult to do it seems. How do we do it? Some of the thoughts offered were to control our impulsiveness. Defeat injustice without destroying each other. Defeat ignorance. Teach interdependence. Improve interconnectedness. Take courageous action. Speak up for the benefit of others. Maintain dignity. We are called to build up instead of tear down. Insure peace for all through nonviolence. People who have no vision are prone to division. We must stand together. Where there is division, we perish. This got my attention. That is scriptural. I Corinthians 12:24-26 says, "But God has so composed the body, giving greater honor to the part that lacked it, that there may be no division in the body, but that the members may have the same care for one another. If one member suffers, all suffer together; if one member is

honored, all rejoice together."

One of the speakers said, know the truth and the truth will set you free. That one got my attention too. That is scripture again (John 8:32). That is truth we can rely on.

John 17:17 tells us, "Sanctify them in the truth; your word is truth. That is truth that can and does transform society. So why is society slow to transform? Sadly, one main reason is so many reject the truth of scripture. God's truth has

been there for us since the beginning of time. Psalm 25:5 says, "Lead me in your truth and teach me, for you are the God of my salvation..." The truth was there for us in the flesh at Jesus time. John 1:14 says, "And the Word became flesh and dwelt among us, and we have seen his glory, glory as of the only Son from the Father, full of grace and truth." Jesus was willing to sacrifice everything as truth to save us. Before Pilate he said in John 18:37, "For this purpose (death on the cross) I was born and for this purpose I have come into the world - to bear witness to the truth.

Everyone who is of the truth listens to my voice." The truth is here for us today and for our future. John 16:13 says, "When the Spirit of truth comes, he will guide you into all the truth, for he will not speak on his own authority, but whatever he hears he will speak, and he will declare to you the things that are to come." We all need a heart full of grace. Truth crushed to the earth will rise again.

May your struggles keep you near the cross. May your troubles show you that you need God. May will all travel together in unity. Praise the Prince of Peace.
