It's Halloween week. It makes us think of spooky, scary things. Well as pastor you can imagine what that makes me think of. We are spooky, scary sinners. Much as we like to avoid this thought by sticking our head in a bobbing for apple barrel, we can't shake this bewitching truth. November 1st is All Saints Day, the day we celebrate that all of the ghosts in our closet have been chased away. It is the day that we recognize that our dark, sinister inner-selves have been cleansed by the Holy Spirit. Our sinful selves are sadly alive and well but we are also a new creation, a saint, a child of God, through the gift of redemption earned for us through Christ's death on the cross. Tap into the power of the Holy Spirit to let the saint in you triumph over the sinner in you.

Does it ever feel like the clutter is going to take over? What is your biggest clutter hog? Is it mail, garage sales, electronic toys, stuff that doesn't work, magazines, to do items, cleaning that needs to be done, laundry, the kids things...? Handicrafts can spark appreciation for simple items. Weave this basket as a gift.

What you need:

- Paper plate
- Pencil
- Scissors
- Yarn (different colors)

What you do:

- In the center of the plate, trace something round. Draw 9 lines (evenly spaced) from the circle to the plate's edge.
- Cut along each line, stopping at the center circle. Trim more of the plate off so the cuts make a gradual V shape.
- 3. Fold the plate's sides upward to form basket sides. Keep these upright as you weave a bowl-shaped basket.
- 4. Begin weaving a length of yarn at the circle's base. Hold the end of the yarn in place as you spread the length over and under each side of the plate.
- 5. Switch colors to make a pattern. Keep the yarn tight as you weave up the sides.
- 6. To finish, bend down any remaining paper. Leave a tail of yarn and tuck it under a woven portion. Share your craft with a friend!
